Founded in 2001, the Ranch provides **100% full scholarship summer program**, monthly retreats and equine therapy for children at risk to learn love, hope and new life skills through positive role modeling and hands-on experiences.

Major Accomplishments in 2016

- Completed over \$1.5 million in capital improvements (including a new bunkhouse and new roads)
- Received 100+ new Tempurpedic mattresses
- Expanded equestrian therapy program to serve more than 150 veterans and their families

WHY WE EXIST-OUR KIDS

Thousands of Iowa children experience various forms of abuse and neglect every day.

The children served by the Ranch may suffer from physical and/or sexual abuse, neglect, parental drug and alcohol abuse, gang violence, instability in family relationships and the absence of one or both parents, and many are in foster care.



More than **1,600** children in the United States die every year as a result of child abuse.

Nearly **9,000** children were subjected to abuse or neglect last year in lowa.

Faithe's Story

How has your story intersected with Wildwood Hills Ranch?

My mom, sisters, brother and I arrived in Iowa after leaving my father. My mom found a job downtown and we stayed at the Boys & Girls Club in Des Moines while she worked. The Club first sent me to Wildwood Hills Ranch when I was 8. The Ranch was safe, fun and they had horses! I remember feeling loved and thinking it was the one week in the summer that I didn't have to think about all the change in my life and worry. I've been back every year for 10 years and now lead ranchers as a team leader.

How has the Ranch made a difference in your life?

Wildwood Hills Ranch has been the biggest positive influence in my life. It changed the path I was on instead of anger and hurt, I was introduced to faith. I started asking questions and going to church. I learned that I have a God who loves me and that is the best thing I could ever ask for.

As a leader at the Ranch, I've learned I cannot be passive. My experiences here have taught me to be loving and patient. Kids don't respond to anger—that's



what they're used to. When you love on them—*that is different*—and it makes all the difference!

How has Wildwood Hills Ranch helped you take the next step in your life?

I've chosen social work for my career path and plan to get a Marriage & Family Therapy License. I want to help families like mine—specifically kids! Wildwood Hills Ranch has shown me there's a deep need and that we can reach these kids and help influence their futures.

Monthly weekend leadership retreats throughout the school year **keep our teens on track** to take the next step in their lives.

Equestrian Therapy Horses are used to help promote physical, occupational and emotional growth.

Interaction with horses in a positive, relaxed environment, with help from equine therapists and horse professionals, allow our students, veterans, active service members and their families the opportunity to explore problematic behaviors and relationship patterns and replace with healthy alternatives.





Equine therapy is helpful treating PTSD, ADD, anxiety, depression, trauma and brain injuries, abuse issues or to simply reduce stress in these contexts:

- Individual therapy sessions
- Group or family therapy sessions
- Veteran therapy sessions
- Horse $\boldsymbol{\vartheta}$ drill teams—ongoing equine therapy in a team setting



150+ veterans and family members participated in our free Saddles After Service program.
