2017 was a monumental year at Wildwood Hills Ranch! Our theme this year was Made on Purpose, for a Purpose. We focused on the concept that each of us is truly unique and there has only been one of each of us created in the history of mankind. We believe each person has a unique role to play and a valuable contribution to make. Part of our role at The Ranch is to help our students understand who they are and what they were put on earth to do.

It was especially satisfying for me this year to watch our Women's Director, who has grown up through our programs, pour out what has been poured into

her. She has seen adversity and has chosen to overcome the many challenges in her way. She is continuing to grow in her faith and in her leadership ability. It was amazing to watch her help other children who have been through challenges understand their value and purpose.

This was also the first year we participated in a longitudinal study by Wheaton College. This study measures effectiveness of the Spiritual Development, Leadership Development, Emotional Intelligence Development, Teamwork and Social Intelligence Development skills that we train on to help our staff and students understand their purpose (see in depth article.) We are excited to apply these results to continue to become more efficient and effective in the work God has called us to do. We also have been constructing and upgrading buildings so that our facilities match what we are communicating to our youth: that they were fearfully and wonderfully made!

We have been intentional in our facility upgrades which has helped us better serve our youth and consistently grow our conference center revenue by roughly 25% per year over the past 5 years. This growth has helped with our sustainability as we are able to earn more revenue rather than rely solely on the generosity of our supporters.

Thank you to each of you for helping us help students understand their purpose in life as we break cycles, build leaders and transform communities.


## 2017 Ranch Accomplishments

## WHEATON COLLEGE STUDY RESULTS

#### **Passion**

At Wildwood Hills Ranch we are passionate about developing leaders. To instill leadership skills in our students requires a well-equipped staff. We are grateful to be blessed with impactful full-time and summer staff to mentor our hundreds of students each year.

#### **Background**

This past year, we were honored Wheaton College Graduate School chose us to participate in a longitudinal study measuring staff growth. It was valuable to have an objective third-party review our staff and monitor development.

Wheaton College chose 12 of some of the top organizations from across the country for the comprehensive study. Wildwood was the only organization within the study that offers a full scholarship to students.

#### **The Study**


The study focused on five staff growth areas to monitor: teamwork, spiritual growth, social intelligence,

leadership and emotional intelligence. Participating staff took two in-depth surveys: one at the beginning of our summer program and one at the end.

#### The Results

We are excited to share that Wildwood showed the highest increase of staff growth over the course of the study! It is humbling how God is developing The Ranch and we can't wait to see what the future holds.

We believe experience and example are two key components to impacting the lives of our youth. The results of this research study encouraged our staff that they are growing as leaders which helps them shape the many students that look up to them.









## Ethnicity








The children we serve are from your local community!

## TRANSFORMING LIVES

Owen and Dillon are genuine examples of what it means to break cycles, build leaders, and transform communities. Their brotherhood journey and connection with The Ranch is a story that inspires many of those who have the pleasure of getting to know them.

**Breaking Cycles.** 

With the termination of the parental rights of their birth parents, Owen and Dillon were shuffled through foster care for three years. When Dillon was 10 and Owen was 8, they became connected with The Ranch through their foster parents at that time (Brett and

Alyson Halley). Their first visit, they were in foster care and once adopted by Jeanine and Roland Minshall, they continued to attend summer programs and weekend leadership retreats year-round.

Prior to coming to Wildwood Hills Ranch, the boys were struggling with feeling accepted and loved. They were living in the cycle of being labeled as foster children and the fear of being separated from one another. Both were dealing with low self-esteem, not feeling like they were "smart", and the need to find a permanent home.

#### **Building Leaders.**

The Ranch made a huge impact on Owen and Dillon's young lives. They had a feeling of instant trust each time they arrived at the peaceful St. Charles destination. It was a place of familiarity. They began to recognize that they had skills and talents. They were smart. There were other people like them. They weren't alone. They began to build confidence.

Dillon shared that he fell in love with The Ranch right away and he came back each session for the people that he met. He said watching the leaders made him want to be like them and that Matt Moeckl (Ranch Executive Director) taught him how to be a gentleman, how to be patient, and how to stand up for himself. "The Ranch helped me find my faith. It opened a lot more gates for me and helped me find out who I was. Through the people I met and everyone that I talked to—I learned something."

Owen shared that he connected with a lot of the people at The Ranch and that he wanted to show a lot of kids that they didn't have to go down the same path as their parents. They could choose their own future. He also learned how to be a gentleman, how to communicate more effectively and how he could share what he was feeling with the people around him. "The Ranch has impacted my leadership skills the most. Watching the team leaders in training made me want to be like them. It strengthened my initiative skills and

the ability to do things on my own."

Through watching and learning from the leaders around them, the boys developed into the role of leaders themselves to other children at The Ranch. Jeanine shared: "Matt provided such a strong male role model for the kids and so many kids have never met a man like him. He made a tremendous difference in their lives like teaching them how to be gentlemen and how to respect women. A lot of kids wouldn't know these things if they hadn't met Matt."

### Transforming Communities.

In the words of Dillon, "everything since The Ranch has been positive." While The Ranch helped the boys

develop a solid foundation, it has been their hard work and leadership that has kept the momentum going now that Dillon is at Iowa State University studying Graphic Design and Owen is wrapping up his senior year at Waukee High.

Dillon is also interning with the ISU athletic program doing design work, in Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity, and continuing to be a shining light and leader to those around him. Owen is leading in multiple school activities: football, baseball, track, show choir (acapella) and a physical therapy school-to-work program. He loves science classes and his just shy of 4.0 GPA is proof of his hard work and dedication.

The traits The Ranch instilled in them: faith, leadership, hope and self-esteem have set them up to continue to transform the lives around them by being involved and dedicated in their communities. One of the most touching transformations was one their adoptive parents personally experienced. Jeanine shares: "They loved the blob, the talent shows and the summer programming—but the memory I remember most is that one year they went (to The Ranch) during the summer and we were Roland and Jeanine and when we picked them up they called us mom and dad."





Our horses are a key part of the programming we do at The Ranch both with our youth and with veterans. Nourished and cared for by Lynn Winkelmann and a team of assistants, they thrive by working in our therapy and drill team sessions.

SADDLES AFTER SERVICE
WILDWOOD HILLS RANCH

Equine therapists and horse professionals utilize the horses to encourage development and healing for our youth and service members that come to The Ranch. Therapy with the horses is helpful in treating PTSD, ADD, anxiety, depression, trauma, brain injuries, abuse issues and stress. In 2017, The Ranch conducted more than 150 sessions with veterans and

their families in our Saddles After Service program.



The Ranch uses individual therapy sessions, group or family therapy sessions, veteran therapy sessions and the horsemanship and drill team programs to assist with development and healing. The drill team is put on by students in our programming who practice choreographed moves with the horses and then perform at horse fairs and parades.

150+ veterans and family members participated in our free Saddles After Service program.


